The successful candidate will demonstrate excellence or clear potential for excellence in teaching university-level courses, a strong commitment to pedagogy and student success and the capacity to bring a theoretical and practical orientation to teaching, learning and program design. The successful candidate will demonstrate good judgment and a reflective approach to teaching innovation. Teaching stream candidates will have a record of pedagogical innovation in high priority areas such as experiential education, technology enhanced learning and community-based learning is preferred as is experience with curriculum development and universal design approaches to teaching and assessment. Professorial stream candidates will be expected to show excellence or promise of excellence in scholarly research, demonstrate an ongoing research agenda and be suitable for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies. The successful candidate in either stream is expected to provide evidence of service contributions or potential to contribute to service in administrative and committee work.

Given Glendon's bilingual mandate, the selected candidate will also participate actively in College-wide service activities in both English and French.
